Charity

Charity isn't just about donations or volunteering. It's about cultivating an attitude of giving being selfless, generous, and understanding. It can mean giving your time, attention, and patience, and even choosing not to get easily offended by others. In today's world, where people are often quick to take offense, focusing on the needs of others can create a ripple of positivity. Imagine if we all became givers of kindness — how much brighter our communities would be.



🔵 Patience

I'll admit, patience is hard — especially in today's fast-paced, technology-driven world. I joked with the students about how even 3-minute YouTube videos seem "too long" for some of my 4-year-old daughter's friends! But patience is a hidden superpower we can all develop. It builds inner strength and resilience, helps us overcome frustration, and allows us to persevere when others might give up. With patience, you can focus on what truly matters and build confidence in who you are.

Devotion

Devotion is about putting your heart into what you care about. Whether it's schoolwork, sports, hobbies, or a cause, it's about giving your best effort and embracing the journey, not just the results. I shared the story of Maximillian Maeder, a 18-year-old kitefoiler ranked #1 in the world and an Olympic bronze medalist. He started competing at age 11, just like many of the students I spoke to, and he said something that truly resonated with me: "Winning isn't everything. I appreciate the process and the journey." It's a powerful reminder to find your passion, devote yourself to it, and persevere — even when the road gets tough. I also encouraged the students to not fear failure, because it's often a key part of success. As long as you've given your best, there's nothing to be ashamed of. In fact, failure teaches us lessons and helps us grow."
